EMPORIA4KT was a project led by FCT NOVA, involving a total of 17 partners from Portugal, Spain, France, Ireland and the United Kingdom. It was a funded initiative under the European Union's INTERREG Atlantic Area program. This Project embraced a robust methodology for technology transfer training and put forth initiatives to develop essential tools and organised workshops among the triple helix— Academia, Industry and Public Authorities. These endeavours were aimed at fostering strong relationships between academia, business, society and government stakeholders within the European Blue Economy.

FIP Portugal joined EMPORIA4KT consortium in the beginning of 2022. It joined during the extension of the Project for 18 months by Interreg Atlantic Area aimed to include FIP Portugal, subsidiary of Frontier IP, and La Palma Research Centre. Additional funding was secured to further promote training activities and tools, including the delivery of a Blue Economy Dashboard. Through this extension, the EMPORIA4KT project achieved a more significant impact, with a specific focus on providing specialized training to early career researchers in the Canary Islands, Spain.
